In the case of the embedded colleges this would be made relatively straightforward by the provision of the Collaboration Agreement that the host universities would 'teach out' the college students so that your studies were not compromised.  If you were studying at one of the Pathway Colleges every effort would be made by OIEG to find you a comparable place to continue your studies. If you were unable or unwilling to take up this alternative place, you would be eligible for a refund of fees or compensation in line with the terms of OIEG's Refund and Compensation Policy. If you are enrolled at the Oxford International Pathways College London, the University of Greenwich will also assist you with completing your programme as part of the validation agreement OIEG have with them.
